Rider Education

Being A Good Team Member

As we begin a new riding season, we thought it appropriate that this month's article should deal with being a good team member when riding together as a group. Being a good team member allows for more fun on the ride because you will know what others in the group are doing and by doing this the ride becomes safer and more enjoyable.

What are the characteristics of a good team member? In the GWRRA Team Riding Manual the following characteristics are very important.

Assumes a responsibility to ride with and work with the other team mem-bers for the safety and protection of the whole team while on the road, and espe-cially, while in traffic.

Maintains steady speed and spacing. Yo-Yoing or straggling behind disrupts the rhythm and efforts of the other team members, and reduces the benefits of riding as a team.

Stays alert and announces to the other team members any obstacle, condition or potential situation which could become hazardous to the team or a team member.

Will be aware of the other team members and maintain the formation (staggered) and a safe riding distance (spacing) between team members. Spacing will be determined by the road, weather conditions, and visibility.

"HOLES" left in the formation (large spac-ing gaps between team members) invites aggressive motorists driving at faster speeds to cut into the for-mation, which may result in tailgating our teammate ahead of us. This creates a very dangerous situation. Each team member must protect the other by main-taining the appropriate spacing.

REMEMBER: Pace yourself I-second stagger, and 2-seconds following distance behind the bike directly in front of you. However, during darkness or inclement weather, a 2-second stagger and a 4-second fol-lowing distance should be maintained to provide an extra margin of safety.

Each team should be separated on the ex-pressway or highway by no less than 15 seconds allow-ing sufficient room for other vehicles to safely pass a team. Distances between teams traveling on two-lane roads may need to be greater.

> Each team travels in a staggered formation within a car lane. The Lead rides at the front of the group, in the left track of the lane. The next team member positions their bike one second behind and in the right tire track of the same lane, the next team member is in the left track two seconds behind the Lead and one second behind the #2 bike in the right track, etc., etc., until all bikes have been positioned.

> Anyone not wishing to Team Ride should separate themselves to a safe distance from the teams and meet at the acknowledged destination or break point.

Next month we will go over more information on riding in a group. In the meantime, Ride Safe!

Motorcycle Loading Procedures



There are a couple of very good reasons to ride a motorcycle aboard a Washington State Ferry. The motorcycle & driver fare is much less than the car & driver fare.

Loading procedures often allow first on, first off privileges with an early arrival prior to departure. Motorcyclists rarely face an overload situation on busy commuter runs, weekends & sunny summer days. Once onboard, please be sure that you don't park your motorcycle in the yellow striped walkways or block vehicle access.

Motorcycle Loading Procedure by Terminal:

Anacortes: Motorcycles must stay in line with vehicles prior to tollbooths. They will then proceed to the front of the dock. First on, first off privilege is limited to 30 motorcycles

Bainbridge: If the ferry is overloading, motorcycles may drive as if "through" traffic on the left and enter the tollbooth. Motorcycles are loaded first at this terminal.

Bremerton: Motorcycles can bypass the traffic line and proceed to the tollbooth. They are loaded first.

Clinton: Motorcycles can bypass traffic and enter the ticket seller's plaza. Everyone must stop at the tollbooth. Follow instructions of the ticket seller to motorcycle holding area. Motorcycles are generally loaded first and if motorcycles arriving after loading has begun they must wait to be loaded on the stern (back) of the vessel after other vehicles have been loaded.

Seattle/Pier 52: Motorcycles can make a right turn into the toll plaza when coming from the north on Alaskan Way or a left when coming from the south on Alaskan Way. Motorcycles are generally loaded first and last.

Edmonds: Motorcycles stay in line with vehicles unless the ferry is overloading and traffic is stopped, motorcycles may drive as if "through" traffic on the left and enter the tollbooth. Motorcycles then proceed to the lower dock and are loaded first.

Fauntleroy: Motorcycles may bypass vehicles when overloading and are loaded first.

Friday Harbor: A limited number of motorcycles may bypass the traffic when the ferry is overloading.

Keystone: Motorcycles may bypass traffic except during the Oyster Run. Motorcycles with a sidecar or trailer, tricycles and groups may not bypass traffic.

Kingston: If the ferry is overloading, motorcycles may drive as if "through" traffic on the left and enter the tollbooth. You would then pay your fare and move to the head of the dock for priority loading. Motorcycles cannot bypass traffic on the highway and use the "local" lane.

Lopez: When the ferry is overloading, a limited number of motorcycles may bypass the line.

Mukilteo: pre-ticketed motorcycles may bypass the tollbooth and will stage in lane #1. For safety and to increase the efficiency of loading and offloading our passengers, queued motorcycles will be loaded near the beginning of the load, after the first few vehicles have been loaded. Motorcycles arriving after loading has begun must wait to be loaded on their stern (back) of the vessel after other vehicles have been loaded. During the summer peak times, bypass the tollbooth and proceed to the front of lane #1 or and walk over to the Passenger Ticket Booth in front of the terminal to purchase a ticket. Give tickets to the Auto Attendants on the dock as you board. Pay close attention to signage in front of & alongside the street side of the tollbooth, indicating whether or not the Passenger tollbooth is open for tickets sales.

Orcas: A limited number of motorcycles may bypass the traffic when the ferry is overloading.

Point Defiance: Motorcycles may bypass traffic when the ferry is overloading.

Port Townsend: Motorcycles have priority at this dock and may move ahead of traffic if the traffic is at a stand still, except during the Oyster Run. Motorcycles with a sidecar or trailer, tricycles and groups may not bypass traffic.

Shaw: A limited number of motorcycles may bypass traffic when the ferry is overloading, except when the ferry is off-loading.

Sidney, BC: Motorcycles must stay in line with vehicles and are "first come, first serve" through the tollbooth.

Southworth: Motorcycles may bypass traffic but must stop at the tollbooth. Motorcycles may not use the exit lane to access the dock.

Tahlequah: Motorcycles may bypass traffic during overloads.

Vashon: If traffic is moving, motorcycles must stay within the normal flow. If traffic is backed up, you may bypass and continue onto the dock.

4th of July Celebration Laurel, Montana


On the morning of July 4th, the Jaycees sponsor a pancake breakfast from 6:00am to 10:00am at Fireman's Park.

Wing Dingers are Coming to Town

Move over Harley Hawg riders, the Wing Dingers are coming to Laurel.

Wing Ding is the world's largest convention of owners of Honda Gold Wing motorcycles. Wing Ding 29 will highlight the celebration of the Gold Wing Road Riders Association's anniversary. This is the association's 30th anniversary

"We're expecting 10,000 to 14,000 people to attend the 29th annual Gold Wing Road Riders National Rally in Billings, July 4-7," said Russ Parpart, Rimrock Wings Chapter Director of the Gold Wing Road Riders Association. Most of the rally activities will be conducted at MetraPark.

Parpart and his wife, Laurie, live in Laurel and expect as many as 100 people to camp out in their yard during the rally. "We expect as many as 6,000 people to attend the Laurel Fireworks Display on July 4," he said. Parpart said he hopes to also have Wing Dingers in Laurel for the Fourth of July Parade.

Parpart said all the hotels, motels and campgrounds in the area are full. "Even Red Lodge, Columbus and Big Timber are full," he said. "The last I heard, there were still some rooms available in Livingston during that time.

"One of the required events for a community to host a national rally is that they provide a fireworks display," Parpart said.

"The Laurel Volunteer Fire Department's Fireworks Display will be a GWRRA sanctioned activity for those attending our rally," he said. "I've been telling everyone that I could that the best fireworks show they will ever see is right here in Laurel."

Parpart said the Laurel Chamber has designated the parking lot at the new middle school, the Avanta Federal Credit Union parking lot, and the Yellowstone Bank parking lot as areas for the Gold Wingers to park their bikes.

The Gold Wingers held their national rally in Billings in 1997 and again in 2000. This is the third time Billings has been selected for the rally. GWRRA has more than 80,000 members.


