
# Lane Changes - Part 1


Last month we talked about lane position while riding in a group and the importance of a safe following distance behind the bike immediately in front of you (2 seconds) and the bike in the other side of the lane in front of you (1 second). Keeping this safe following distance, or cushion, is the basis for all lane changes done by the group, whether the lane change is done by all bikes at once, or from the front of the group or from the rear.

To change as a complete group, there are only three steps:

Step 1: The lead bike asks the drag bike to secure the lane.



Step 2: The drag bike moves into the desired lane and notifies the lead bike when it is safe to make the lane change.



Step 3: When the lane is clear for ALL BIKES to move simultaneously, the lead bike orders the lane change and ALL BIKES move over at the same time.


This does two things: by moving in unison, the spacing between the bikes remains unchanged and there are no violations of the 1 second rule. Secondly, a well executed lane change is a joy to watch. It shows others how practiced the group is with their drill team precision.

However, even if the lead bike announces the lane change, it is still your responsibility to look out for your own safety. This means looking to the side to make sure the lane is clear.

Bad example: Bikes 2 and 4 have started to move over before the call, coming too close to the bikes

in front of them. This usually happens right after the tail gunner lets the lead bike know when it is clear.



Next month: Changing lanes from the rear.



And remember: Drive on the right except to pass...





# So Happy It's Thursdays Road Kill Cafe Special Instructions

- 1. Cats and Dogs: Guys, please don't tell us if you are sending in your wife's favorite cat or dog. We want no part of a divorce case.
- 2. Skunks: Please thoroughly clean all skunks before sending them in. Our chef gets excited at the smell of fresh killed skunk. Kind of reminds him of good ol' home cookin.
- 3. Squirrels and Chipmunks: Send in only head and upper body shots. Sorry but there just isn't enough left to fool with after a full body shot with a radial tyre.
- 4. Woodpeckers, Crows, Neighbors Chickens and any other "birds of opportunity:"
- Don't forget to chill any windshield or grill kills as soon as possible as birds tend to spoil fast. Also, it's unwise to pick up any road kill birds from the side of the road because of uncertain quality. We charge a \$1.00 per bird plucking fee if you send them in unplucked. charge 10 cents per pound extra for smoked and 15 cents per pound extra for salt curing. Only 100% hickory wood is used in our smokers.
- 5. Road Kill Cafe Chops, Steaks and Smoked Meats We charge a \$50.00 flat fee plus 35 cents per pound processing fee to convert your road kill into chops, steaks, roasts and ribs. Only road kill with a dressed out weight of 50 lbs or greater can be processed this way which eliminates all smaller animals and most dogs - so choose your garbage can raiders carefully if you want pooch steaks. We charge 10 cents per pound extra for smoked and 15 cents per pound extra for salt curing. Only 100% hickory wood is used in our smokers.
- 6. Road Kill Cafe Special Save up your road kill and save yourself some beer money! Send in 10 or more small animals to be processed into Smith stew and save 10 cents per pound on the order!






