







# Rider Education



### Handling low-speed maneuvers

Attend any bike week event or rally and you'll see riders doing things that make you nervous: paddling their feet at stops, duck-walking their bikes across gravel drives and dropping their bikes in parking lots. Though not usually injurious (except cosmetically to the bikes), these low-speed situations have a common cause, and each can be easily cured with a little practice. The main problem in each of these situations is a lack of confidence and technique. To overcome this, a rider needs to practice with the friction zone of the clutch—it ranges from the point at which the clutch begins to engage, to the point at which it becomes fully engaged. In a quiet paved area, such as a parking lot, practice feeding in throttle as you engage the clutch. Your goal is to be able to make quick, confident and immediate starts without excessively slipping the clutch, and to be able to lift your feet to the pegs or footboards immediately while accelerating to stabilize the bike. Ride in a straight line until you feel confident, then make a U-turn and ride back the other way and repeat.

About that U-turn...you'll likely find yourself throttling down and making a set of jerking corrections as you try to force the bike to turn. Here's a tip to really smooth out your low-speed turns: Apply and gently drag the rear brake as you make that turn while simultaneously maintaining throttle control. Coordinate the throttle and brake while leaning and you won't believe how smoothly and confidently you can perform these low-speed maneuvers. It helps to sit straight up—like dirt-track racers do—and push the bike down into the turn with your weight on the outside peg or floorboard.

Things get a little tricky as we move to a gravel parking lot. If you've done any dirt riding, you may have heard the dirt-rider's adage, "When in doubt, gas it!" This motto refers to the fact that going too slow in a straight line on an uneven surface, causes the front wheel to drop into ruts and be slapped around by rocks, causing the bike to jar, veer, and erode your confidence. That's why riders duck-walk their bikes in the gravel.

Instead, now that you have your quick starts dialed in, find a nasty, straight section of gravel road or parking lot, pick out your path and eventual stopping point, and let 'er rip.

Grab those grips, spin the back tire if you wish, spray a little gravel and accelerate through that section with your feet up. Your goal is to go through fast enough that the front tire rises and floats over the high points without dropping into the ruts, so it smoothes out.

Allow the bike to squirrel around; stay loose on it. Just be aware that when you slow down again, the tire will drop back into those ruts and things will momentarily get rough. Keep a firm grip, apply the rear brake aggressively and be prepared to get those feet back down.

# 4th of July Trip to Southern Oregon

It is amazing how quickly we forget how hot it gets during the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade in Eagle Point, OR. Having done that, I thought another trip to Southern Oregon for a few days of riding, rafting, and frying your brains out while wearing a hot helmet would be a good idea. I was able to convince seven couples from San Jose and Ron and Kathy Johnson from Chapter E to meet on the Rogue River in my old home town of Shady Cove. Most camped in RVs and some stayed across the street at the motel.



Fortunately for us, the cooler Northwest weather hit the valley as well and I don't think it got hotter than 95. The RV park is right on the river so it tended to be a little cooler. All day long, rafts, kayaks, and boats would float by with the occupants in various stages of sunburn.

Once again we headed north to visit the Rogue River Gorge and Crater Lake. The river narrows down into a very tight chute and makes for some most excellent photo ops.







We continued on to Crater Lake where it was so crowded that we weren't allowed to go to the lodge because there were no parking spaces left, even for bikes. We turned to follow the ridge road and stopped at the first bare pavement (did I mention snow?)



The clear sky gave the water a striking blue color. The group was so taken by the view that they momentarily forgot about the 739 other tourists all vying to stand in the same spot (see above paragraph.)

We didn't stay as long as we would have liked because, unknown to us at the time, we had a date with disaster, and we couldn't be late.

It all started out innocently enough: fit 17 people into 3 large rafts and float leisurely down the river. Little did I know that my friends (at least some of them) were insane. Silly me. In spite of my repeated yelling to paddle to the left, some felt that a water cannon battle was in order, so we were swept into the *Channel Of Death*. Striking the jagged rocks and tree branches with extreme force, we ripped a 16 inch gash in the new, \$4000 raft. Lana and Kathy were immediately up to their waist in water, and to make a long story short, it took us at least 30 minutes to get everyone out of the raft, the people redistributed into the 2 good rafts, and for 3 of us to fix the damaged one and attempt to float the rest of the way down. Fortunately, the rest of the trip was uneventful – just floating and relaxing. Then I had to explain to my friend that rented us the rafts what happened. After he quit crying, he said not to worry about it, it happens all the time... I'm not sure I believe him.

The next day was the 4<sup>th</sup> and we had the Pancake Breakfast, the Parade, the trip to Lake of the Woods for lunch, and the world class Eagle Point Fireworks Display after dark. We lined up at the High School to decorate our bikes and actually took second place in the auto category. There are no pictures of us in the parade because Lana was taking Ron Johnson to the hospital. If you look closely at the picture on the right you can see the red ribbon.



Lake of the Woods is always a great place to ride to. The scenery is amazing with Mt. Pitt in the background. The Lodge always serves a good lunch.





No one that hears me say that the Eagle Point fireworks are some of the best you will ever see believes me until they see for themselves. The newcomers were all yelling

and screaming with the rest of the crowd, especially when the skydivers landed in the middle of the football field – you had to be there.

In the middle of the week the group split into two parts – one going back to San Jose, with the Johnsons and us going to Brookings for some days at the beach to enjoy the cooler temperatures and the gale force winds. We camped at Harris Beach State Park, walked on the beach, and sat under trees in our campsites and read. It was very relaxing. Ron and I did manage a ride up 101 to take more pictures.

# The Omak Ride Report

On Saturday, June 26<sup>th</sup>, a contingent of Chapter-E bikes left for a 500 mile, 2-Day ride to Omak via Leavenworth and Coulee City. There were initially two groups with the first group leaving Bothell about 9:30 AM lead by our fearless ride leader Bob Spencer arriving in Monroe about 30 minutes later where the second group joined the ride. From Monroe we had about 16 bikes heading over the Stevens Pass broken into several segments due to traffic conditions. As was the norm, the ride to the summit of the pass was cold and cloudy (we were almost on top of a layer of clouds near the summit)





As we started down on the east side of the Cascades, the sun broke out which enhanced the beautiful views alongside the Tye River with its multitude of rapids.

Stopping in warm and sunny Leavenworth for some mandatory shopping, we enjoyed a break before continuing on Highway 2 alongside some apple orchards before coming into Wenatchee. From here we rode north alongside the east side of the Columbia River for about 12 miles before turning east across miles of flatlands with vast wheat fields. We made a brief side trip to Dry Lake to enjoy its impressive views.





Following our rest stop at Dry Lake, we continued on through Coulee City and north along Banks Lake to Grand Coulee. The Grand Coulee dam was spilling water at an impressive rate due to the spring snow melt. We all resolved later that evening that a future ride to Grand Coulee to watch the evening laser light show would be a great idea . Arriving about an hour later in Omak, we settled into the hotel and everyone relaxed near the pool telling ride stories and making attempts to sing on key. Later we invaded the local Mexican restaurant where we almost overwhelmed the staff.

On Sunday morning with not a cloud in the sky, we left Omak heading west on Highway 20 arriving in Winthrop where most of the group enjoyed breakfast in this very unique town. About 1:00 PM, we left Winthrop and headed west again on the North Cascades highway with its spectacular views. We stopped at the summit where group photos were taken and several people attempted to start a snowball fight. Steve Lee had a camp robber bird eating out of his hand.










After leaving the summit we arrived at Diablo Lake with its simply spectacular views. We spent about 45 minutes here absorbing one of the most beautiful views in the USA.


