May is Motorcycle Awareness Month

OK, so May is motorcycle awareness month. What the heck does that mean? Well it means different things to different people. For most of us, we know about it but that's about it. We assume that something happens and guess what, there are events around the state that happen to bring awareness to motorcycles. Here's a few things that happen:

- The State of Washington puts out press releases that explain the detail reasons and details behind Motorcycle Awareness Month. The tv stations, radio stations, various websites and social media pick up on this and typically due stories that the non motorcycling public reads. Hopefully this helps people think a little more about motorcycles
- Motorcycle groups and clubs have related activities that focus attention on raising the motoring public about motorcycles
- Reader boards on state highways and freeways will run reminders to look for motorcycles. This happens all over the country and not just during May!
- Washington State produces a great video that has been picked up by many other states and motorcycle training and safety groups. It has gone viral with about 360,000 views on YouTube. You can watch it [here](#).
- GWRRA has a Motorist Awareness program that is a public outreach to driver training schools and service organizations. This is another great way to raise awareness about us!

So why do all of this? Most drivers don't pay attention anyway. It's difficult to quantify the effects of any of these efforts and any relationship to lowering motorcycle accidents and fatalities. There is some anecdotal evidence it does have some effect of drivers' habits and incident levels. Motorcycle awareness programs should be and are part of a bigger and more comprehensive focus. This includes education for student drivers, education for riders and ongoing public awareness and education.

So what can you do about this? It's pretty simple. Talk to your non riding friends and remind them it's you out there. This humanizes motorcyclists for folks and I believe that changes the equation. Rider aware that drivers have a difficult time seeing you, processing how fast you're riding and what your intentions are. Be clear in your communications on the bike and be courteous to your fellow riders and drivers out there. Most of all enjoy the ride!!

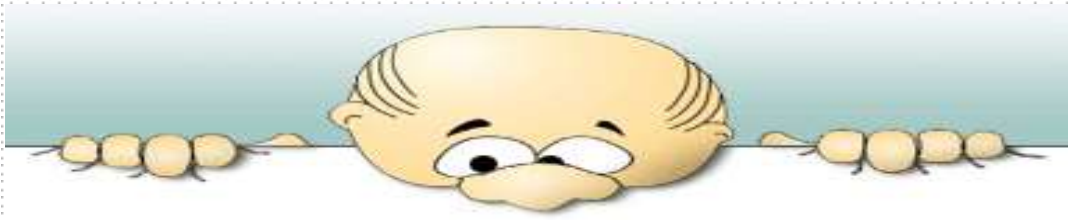
